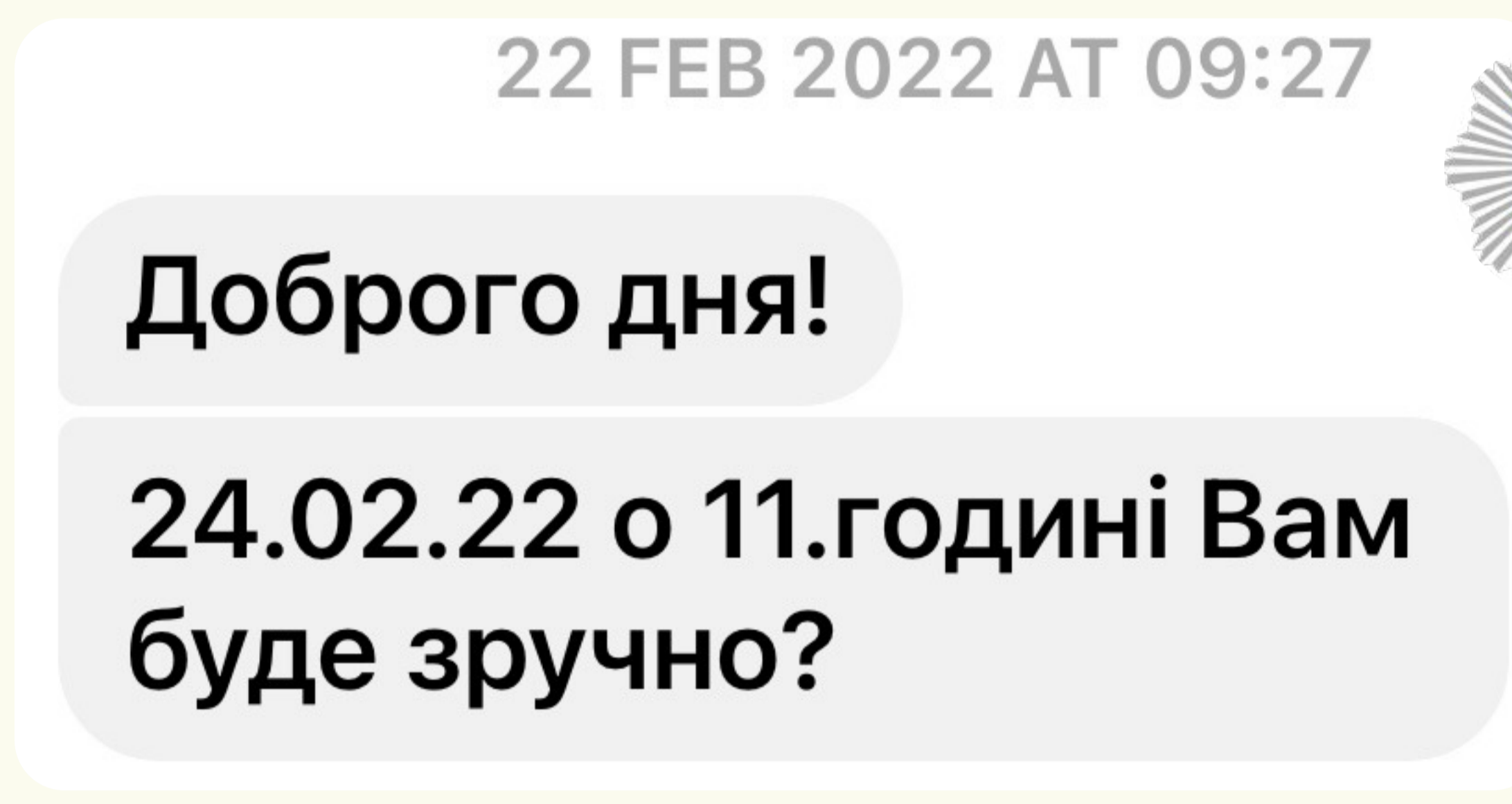
# **THE YEAR OF FULL-SCALE RUSSIA'S WAR AGAINST UKRAINE**



# FEBRUARY



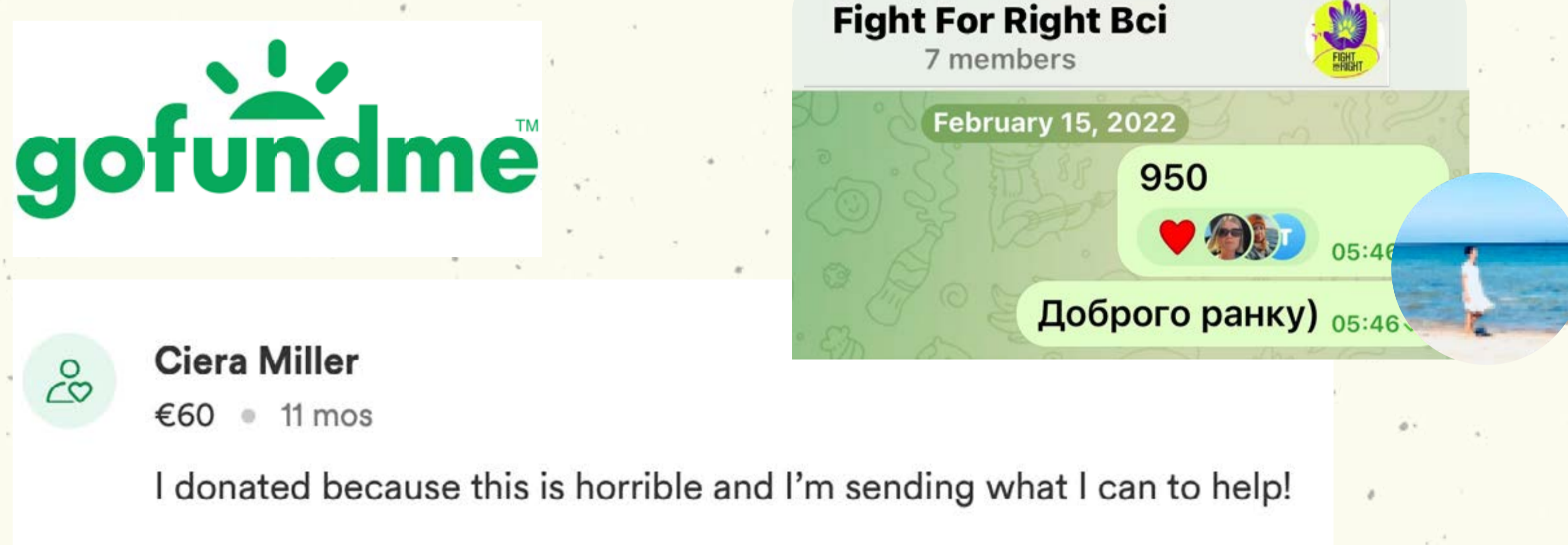
At Fight For Right, we prepared for a full-scale war between Russia and Ukraine: we negotiated with government agencies regarding the availability of shelters, bomb shelters, and evacuation routes; we learned about standards from international partners and organizations; the team developed instructions and algorithms for actions, and provided resources...



In Ireland, Yuliia Sachuk enlisted the support of a classmate from the United States, Avery Horn, who, together with Iryna Tekuchova, from the first minutes of Russia's full-scale war against Ukraine, began to coordinate work to save the lives of the team, and later all Ukrainian men and Ukrainian women with disabilities...

## 14.02

Fundraising has started for [GoFundMe](#) for immediate assistance to people with disabilities in Ukraine. During the day, we collected the first thousand euros.



## 19.02



A hotline to support people with disabilities started working, which we launched because we realized that in the event of war, people will have no one to expect help from. The line is the only one in the country to help Ukrainian women and Ukrainian men with disabilities.

Accepted **18298** requests for a year.

## 24.02



The beginning of a full-scale war between Russia and Ukraine. Actions calling for an end to the war and support for Ukraine are taking place all over the world. They are joined by friends, acquaintances and partners of Fight For Right. Among them – Peggy and Nancy from Germany from Frankfurt-Słubice Pride, who organized an action on the Polish-German border and read out our appeal.



Front Line Defenders provided assistance for the evacuation of the team and ensuring security.

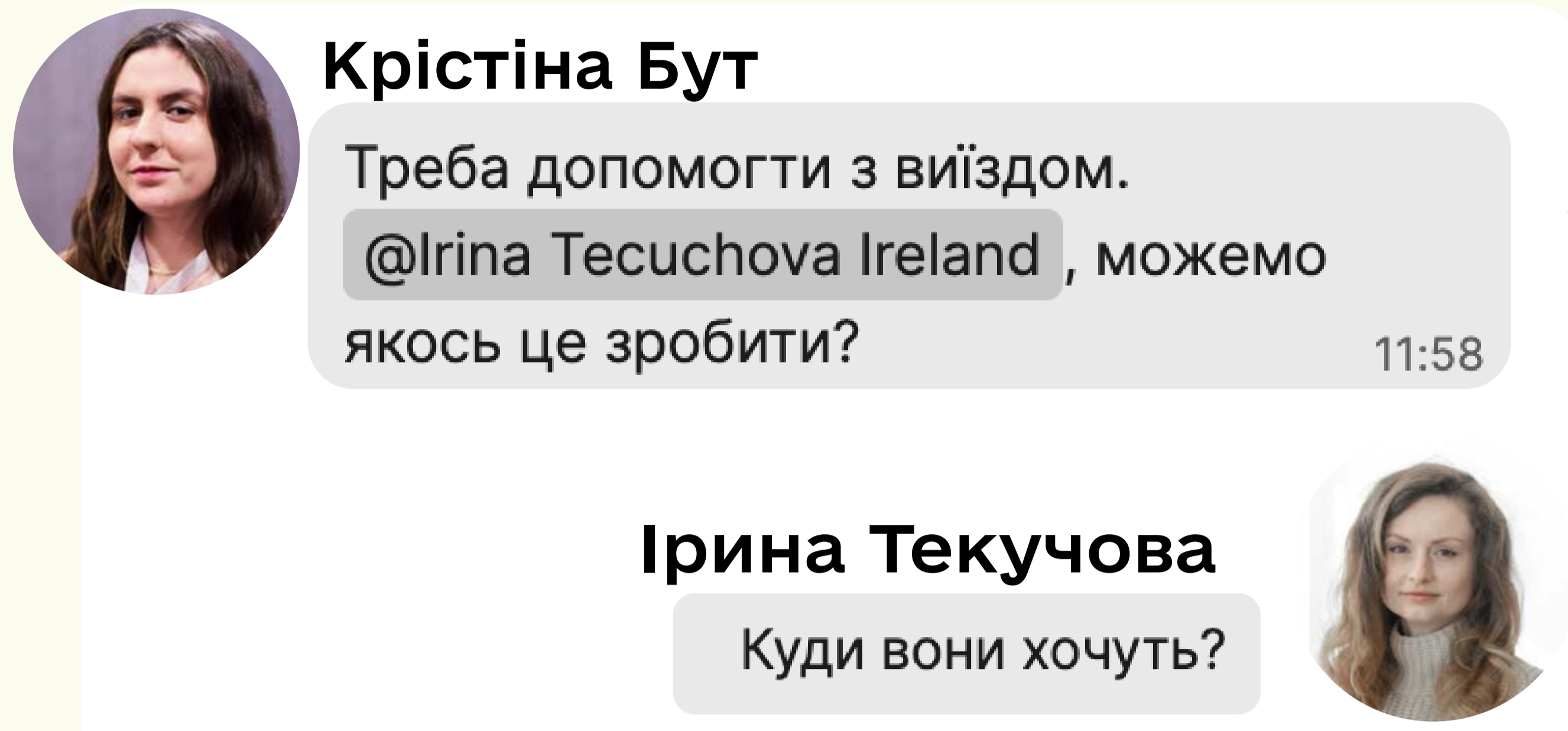
Building of an International Emergency Response Mechanism Fight For Right after one small message from Anna Landry, who offered her help.

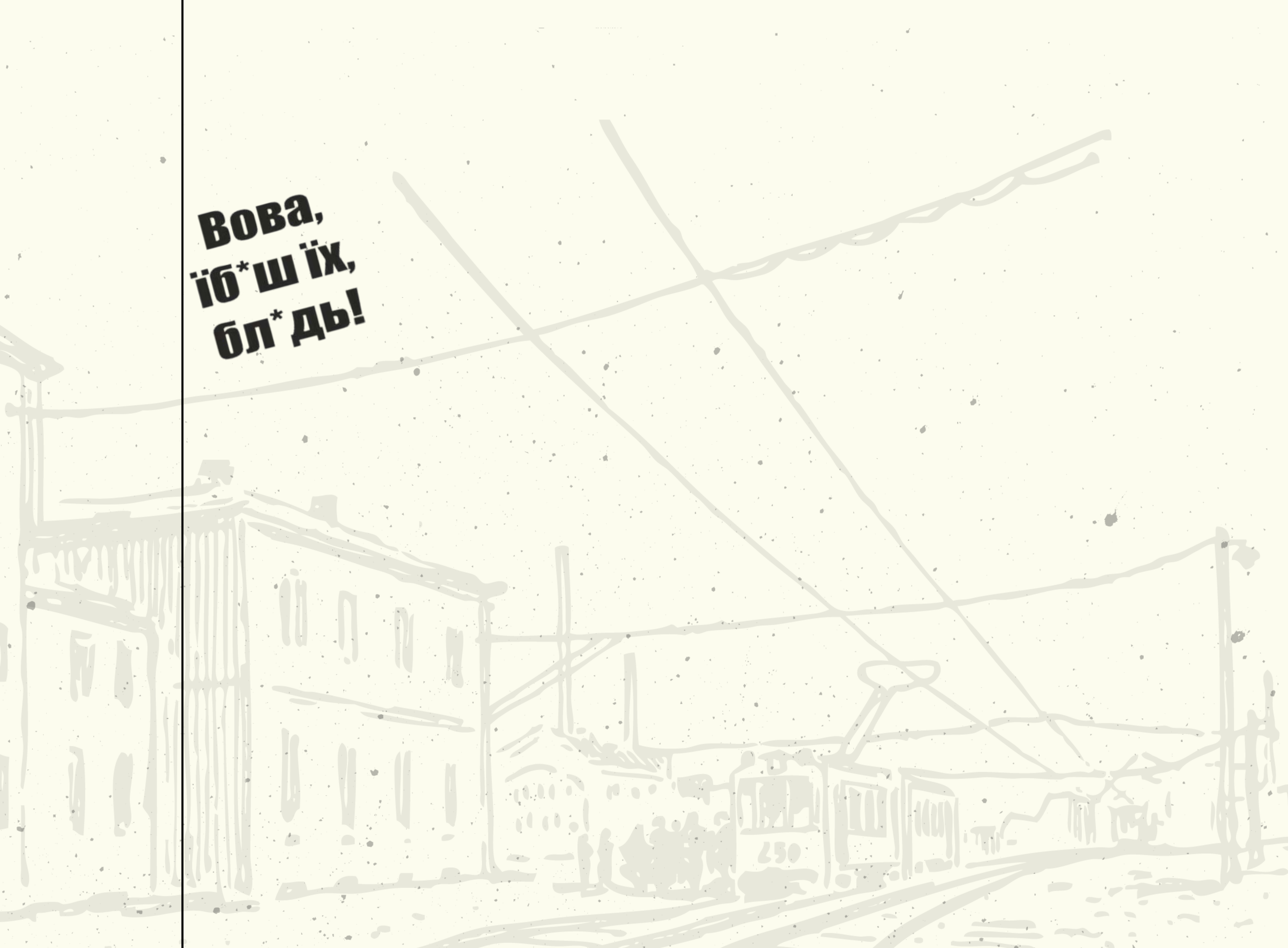

The first evacuation of a **family with 5 children from Pryluky** (Chernihiv region) to Ivano-Frankivsk was carried out.

This was the first step towards creating an emergency response mechanism for Ukrainian women and Ukrainian men with disabilities.

**The Emergency Response Team of case managers works 24/7, advising, organizing evacuations, and providing the most necessary assistance.**

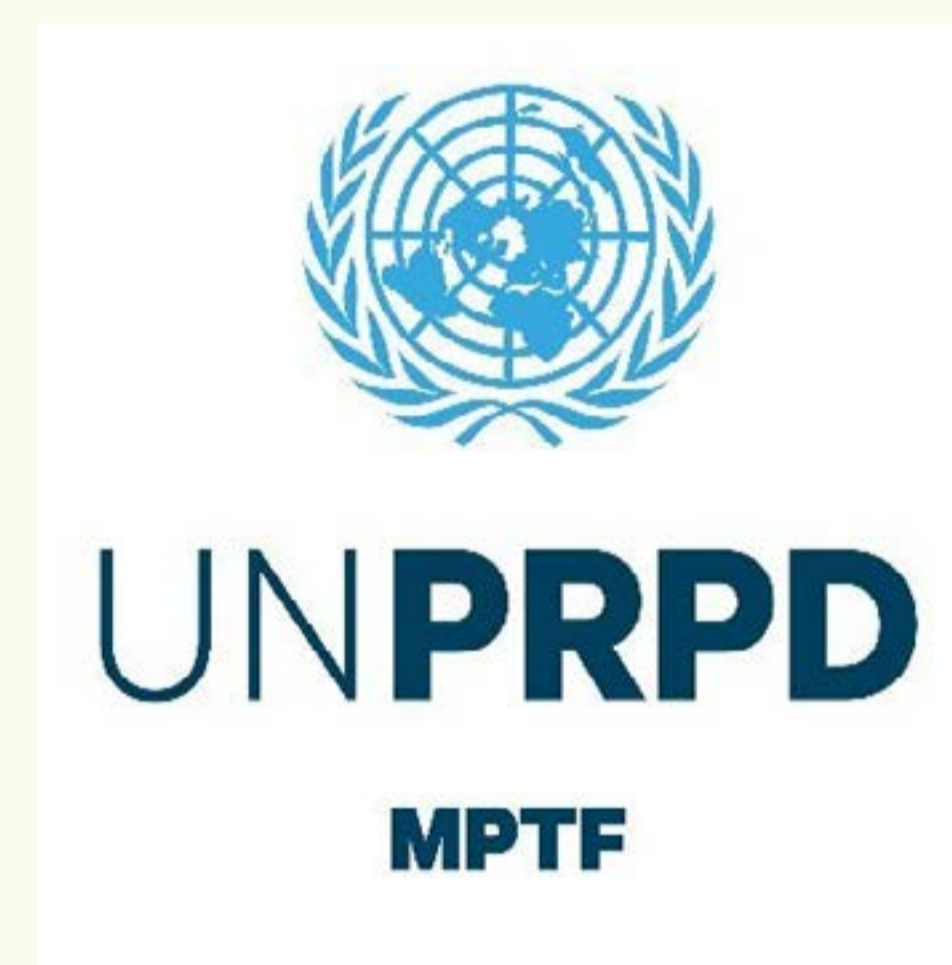


# MARCH



From the first days of March, Fight For Right began [advising people with disabilities](#) regarding the border crossing rules, they were the first to point out to the border service the need to change them.

Fight For Right became an acting partner of UN PRPD, the UN Partnership for the rights of people with disabilities, which is currently implementing the program “Integrating gender-sensitive inclusion of disability in humanitarian assistance in Ukraine – Stage 1” in Ukraine.

Carried out the first medical evacuation on the route Brovary–Lviv. Thanks to our partners, IFES Ukraine was able to pay for medical transport and organize logistics for a family with a child who had to be connected to life support devices during transportation.

**The International Emergency Response Mechanism employs team members, the National Human Rights Network Fight For Right, friends, and volunteers from abroad. A professional case management system is being developed. Support comes from old and new partners and businesses.**

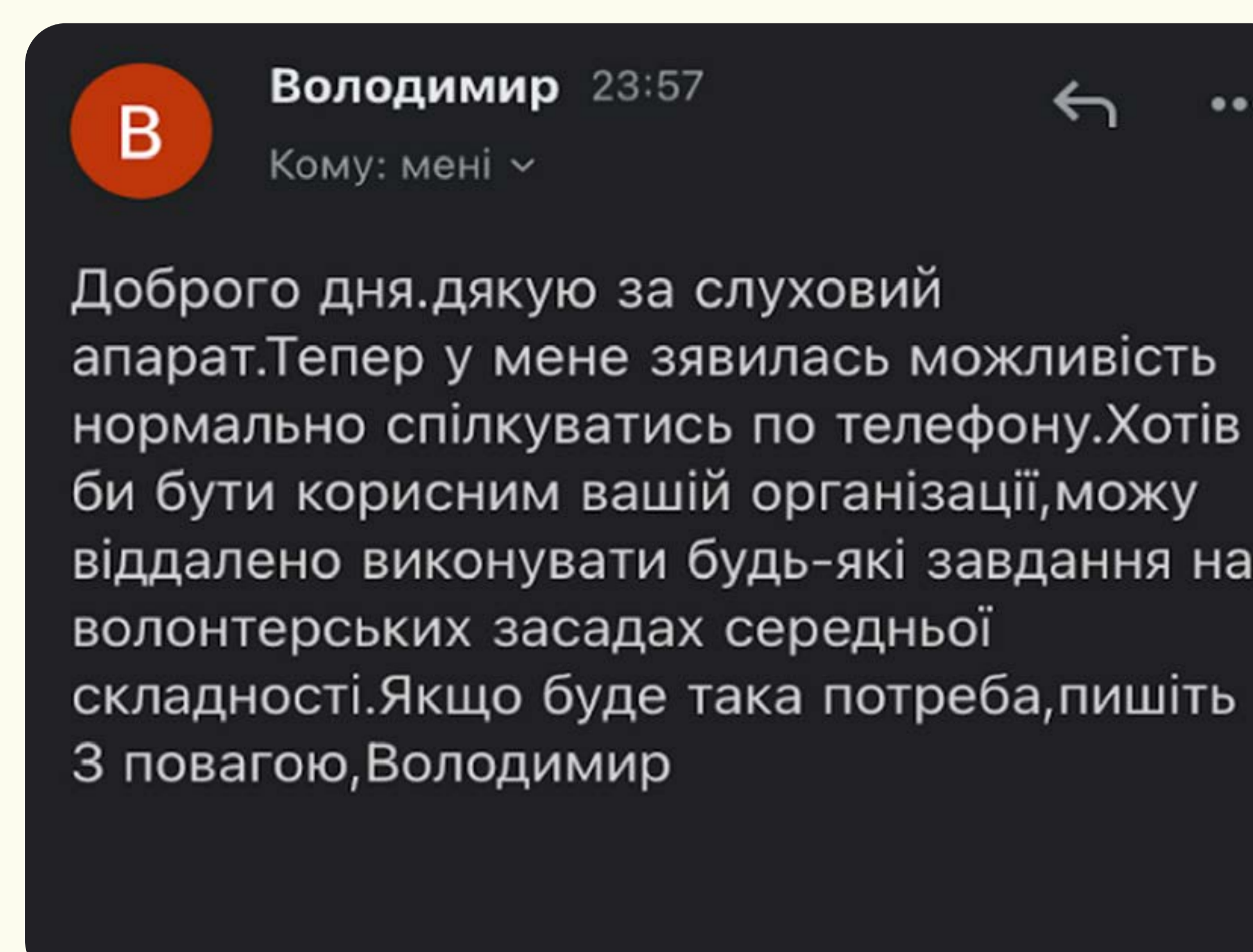
Next Anatolii Melnyk's granddaughter will be named after our manager Victoria ❤️

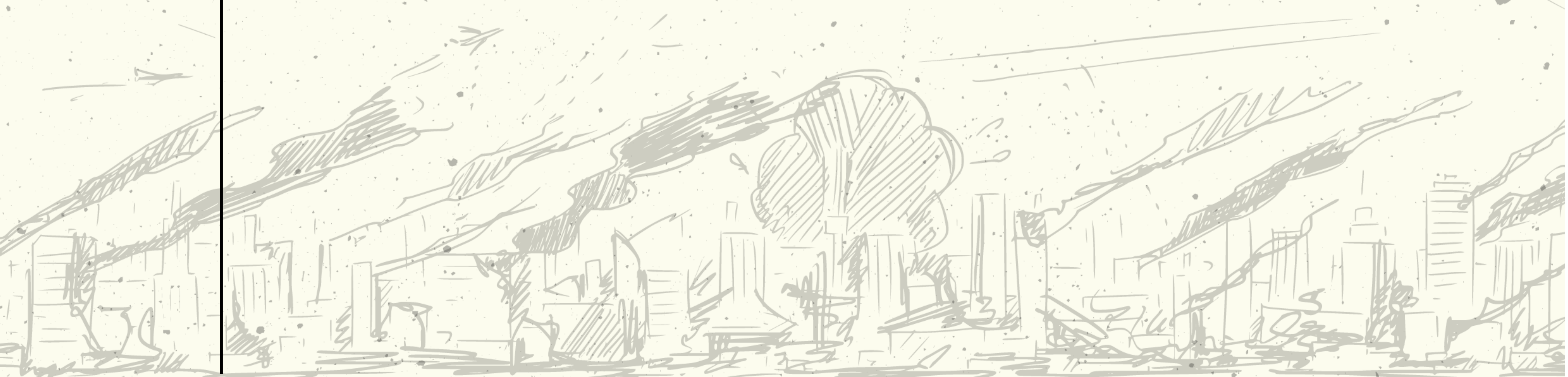

In March, we resumed analytical work. We analyzed gaps in the state's work on planning and organizing evacuations and other humanitarian actions during the war – [published the first analytical report.](#)

Evacuation, assistance with vital medicines, assisted technologies, rehabilitation, treatment, financial assistance, hygiene products, shelter, legal and psychological services were included in the list of emergency response services for Ukrainian women and Ukrainian men with disabilities from Fight For Right.

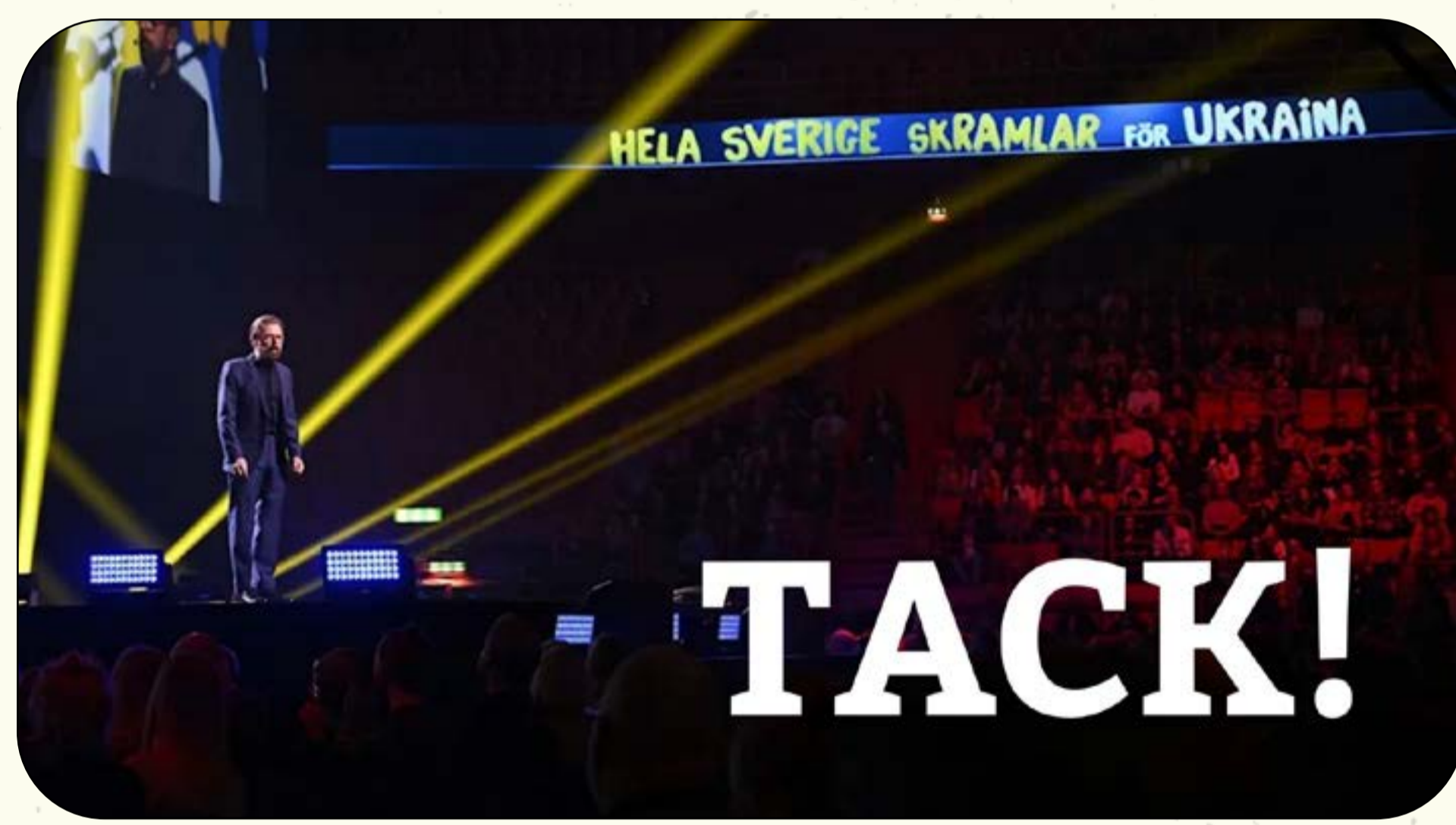

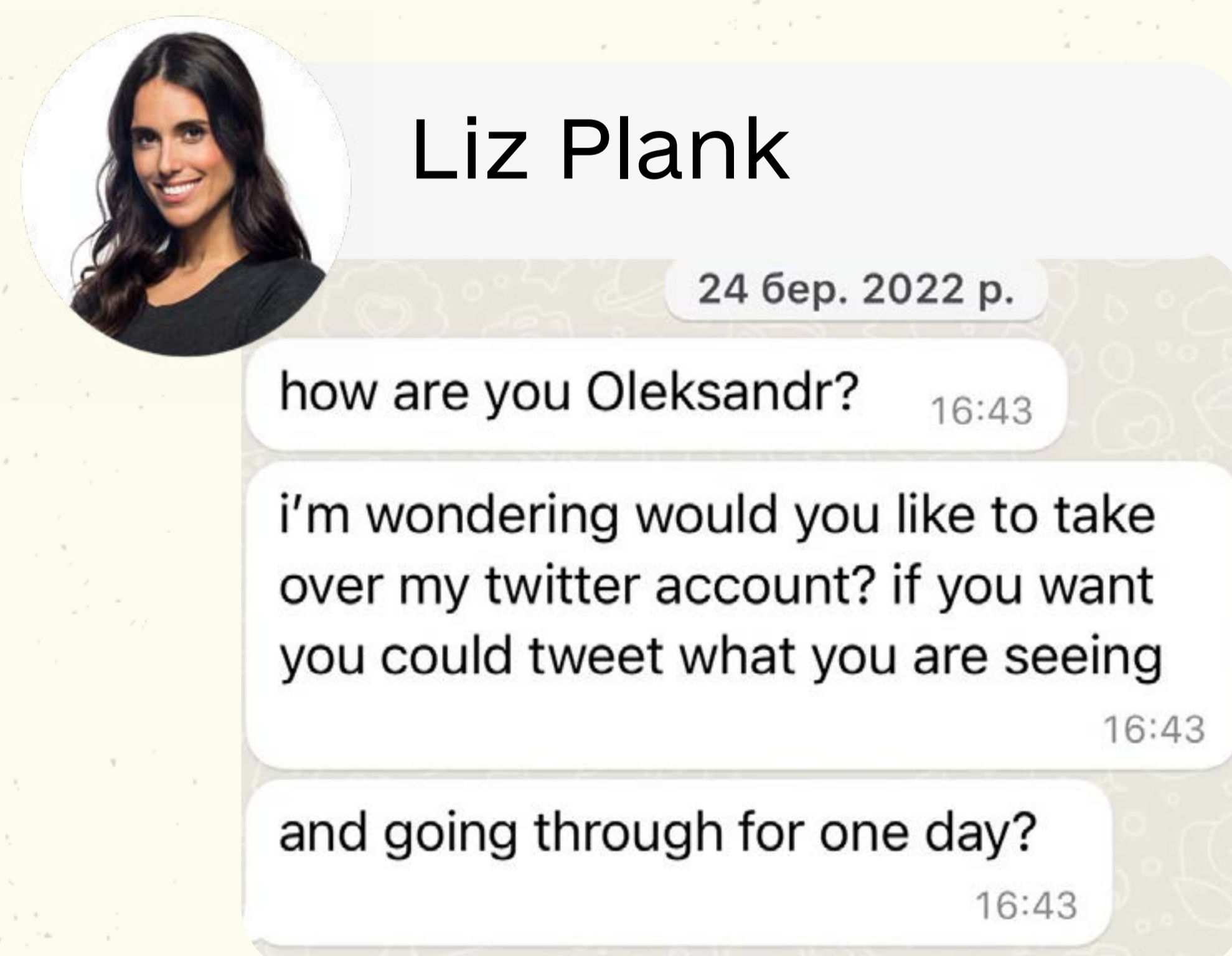
Route: Ukraine – Slovakia – Austria – Germany – France. End Point: sports base in Kreps, near Paris.

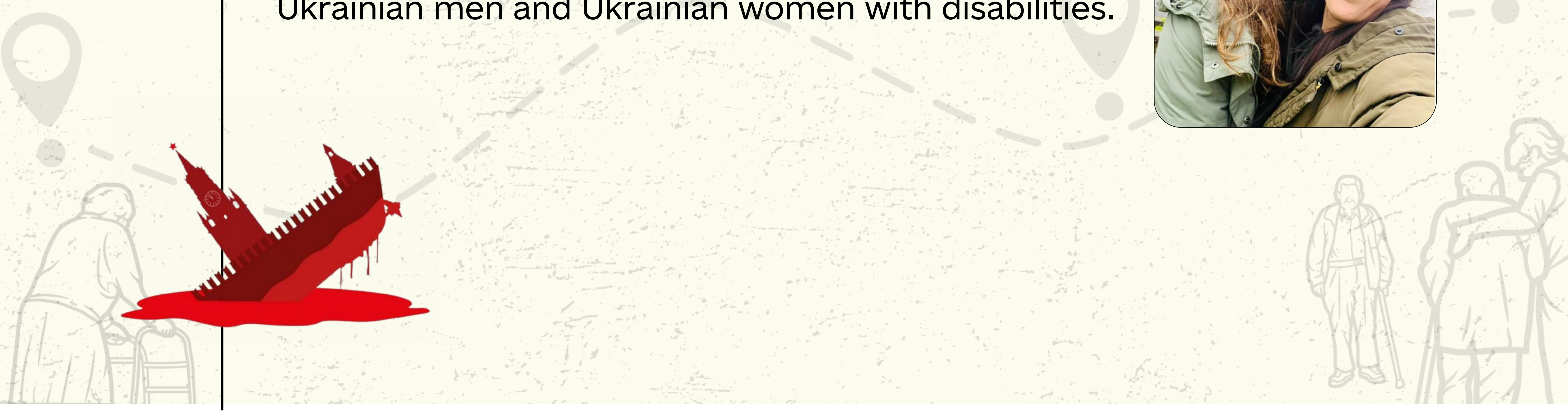

We often receive requests from relatives of people with disabilities who have been left in boarding schools by the state without any chance of rescue and assistance. Establishments were under occupation, often – without the ability to meet basic needs, and people – without communication with the outside world and without the ability to evacuate. Therefore, Fight For Right begins monitoring the observance of human rights in institutions. The results are published in preliminary report on the situation of adults with disabilities and older people in places of non-freedom during a full-scale war.

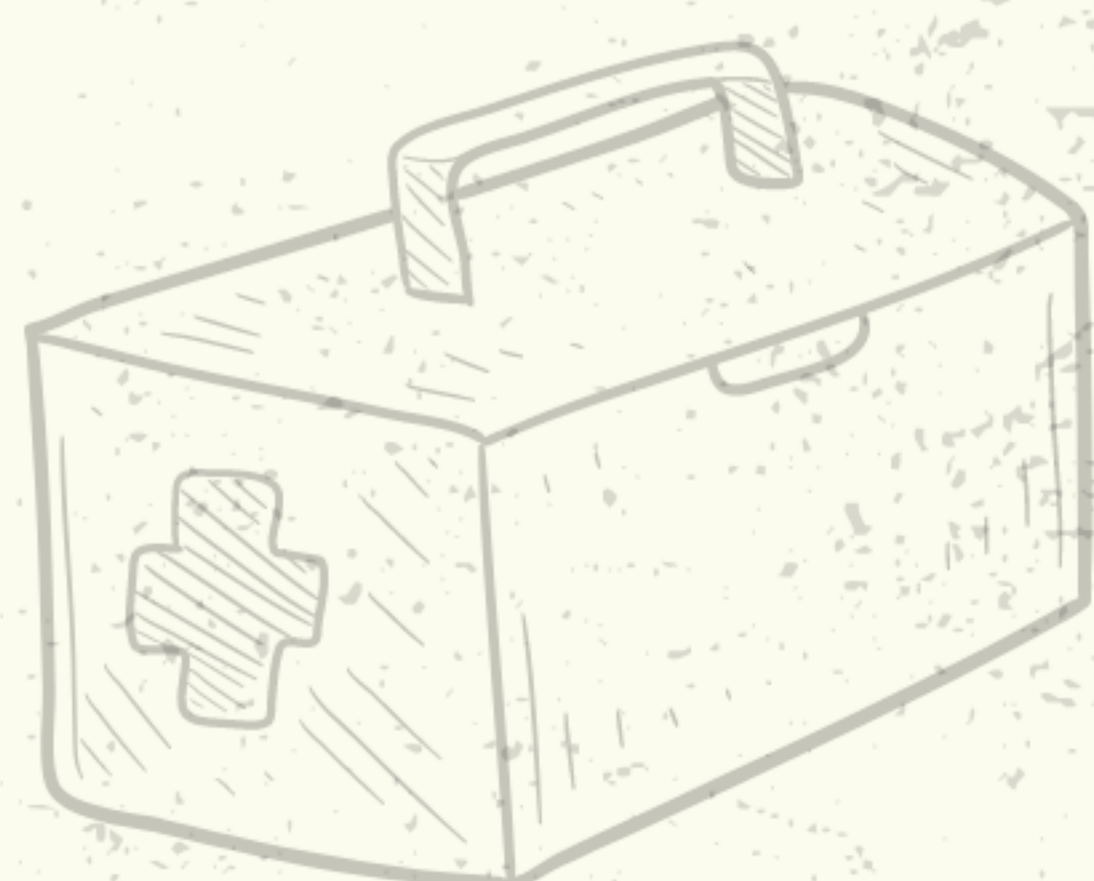

Received the first ambulance for medical evacuation from the Legacy of War Foundation! Subsequently, its head and documentary photographer Giles Duley will write after visiting Ukraine:

**“Destruction on a scale that I have not seen in twenty years of documenting conflicts”.**

With the help of an ambulance, we saved thousands of people, and Giles became the first UN Commissioner for the rights of people with disabilities in the context of war and peace building.

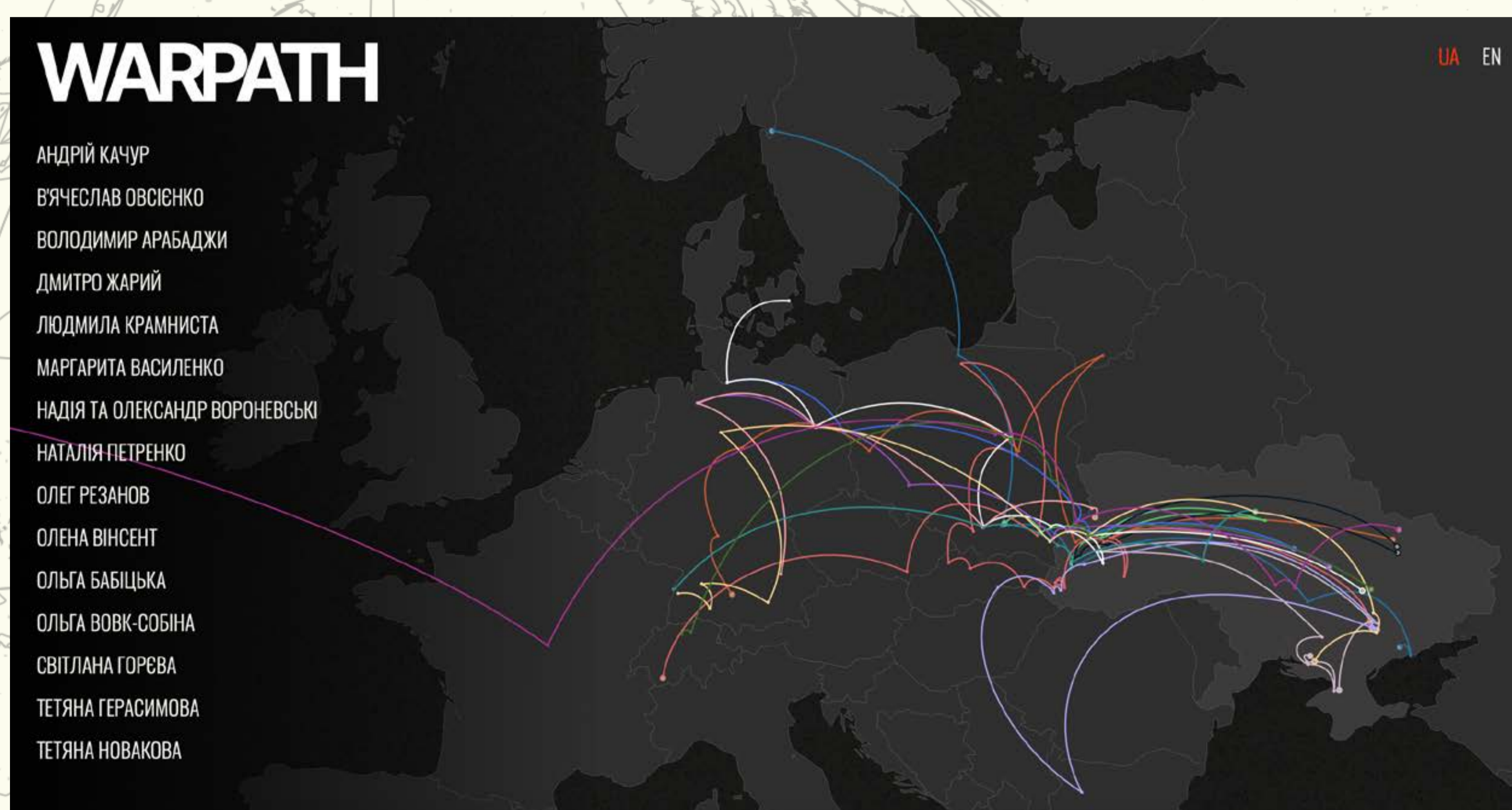

Fight For Right joined [the Coalition “Ukraine. Five in the morning”](#).

The Coalition has been documenting war crimes and crimes against humanity committed by the Russian army since the first days of Russia's full-scale war against Ukraine. Fight For Right considers it mandatory in documenting not to ruin any war crime committed against people with disabilities. Together with members of the Coalition, Fight For Right is preparing to launch a project to monitor places of non-freedom in the de-occupied territories in August.

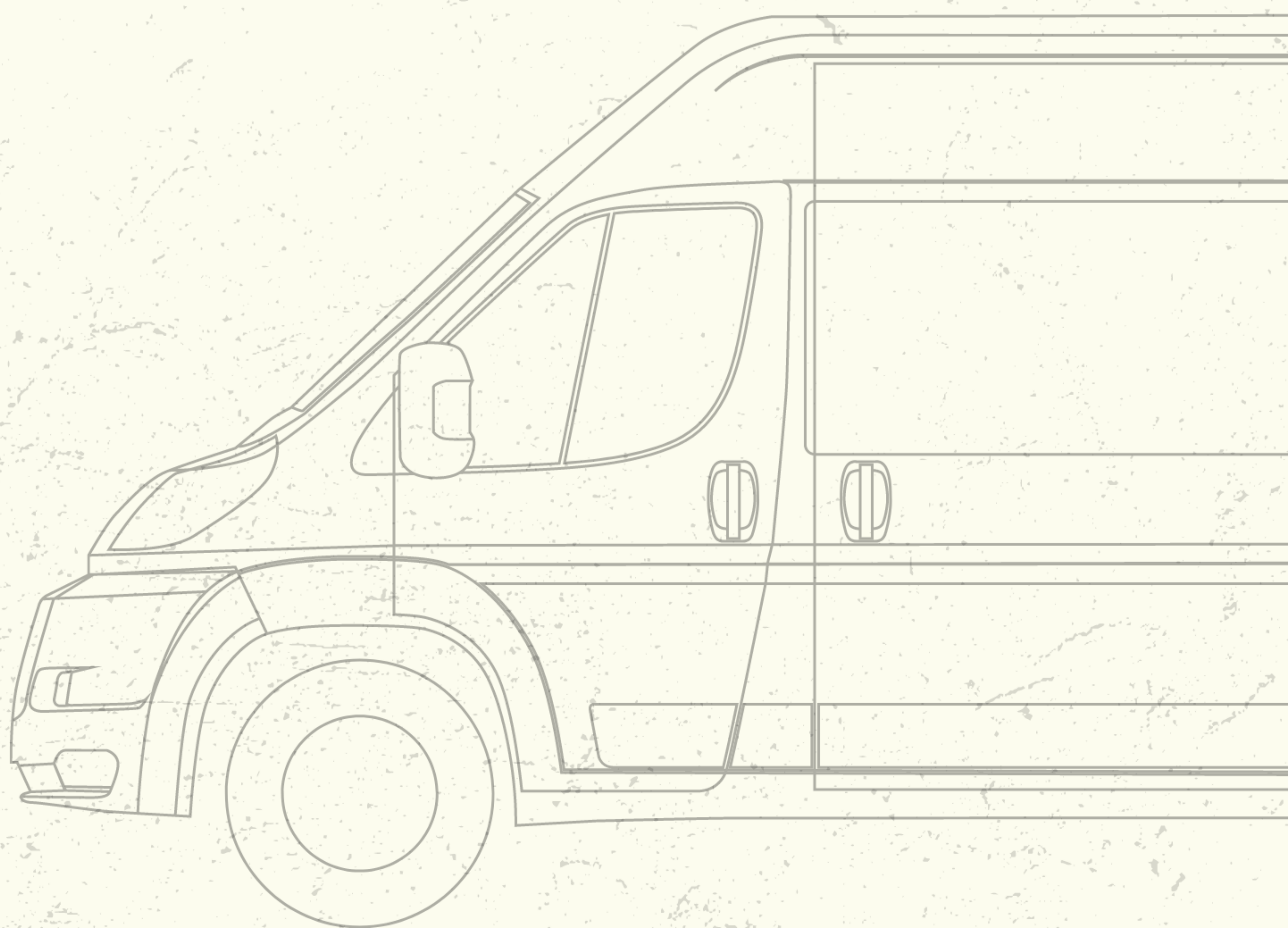
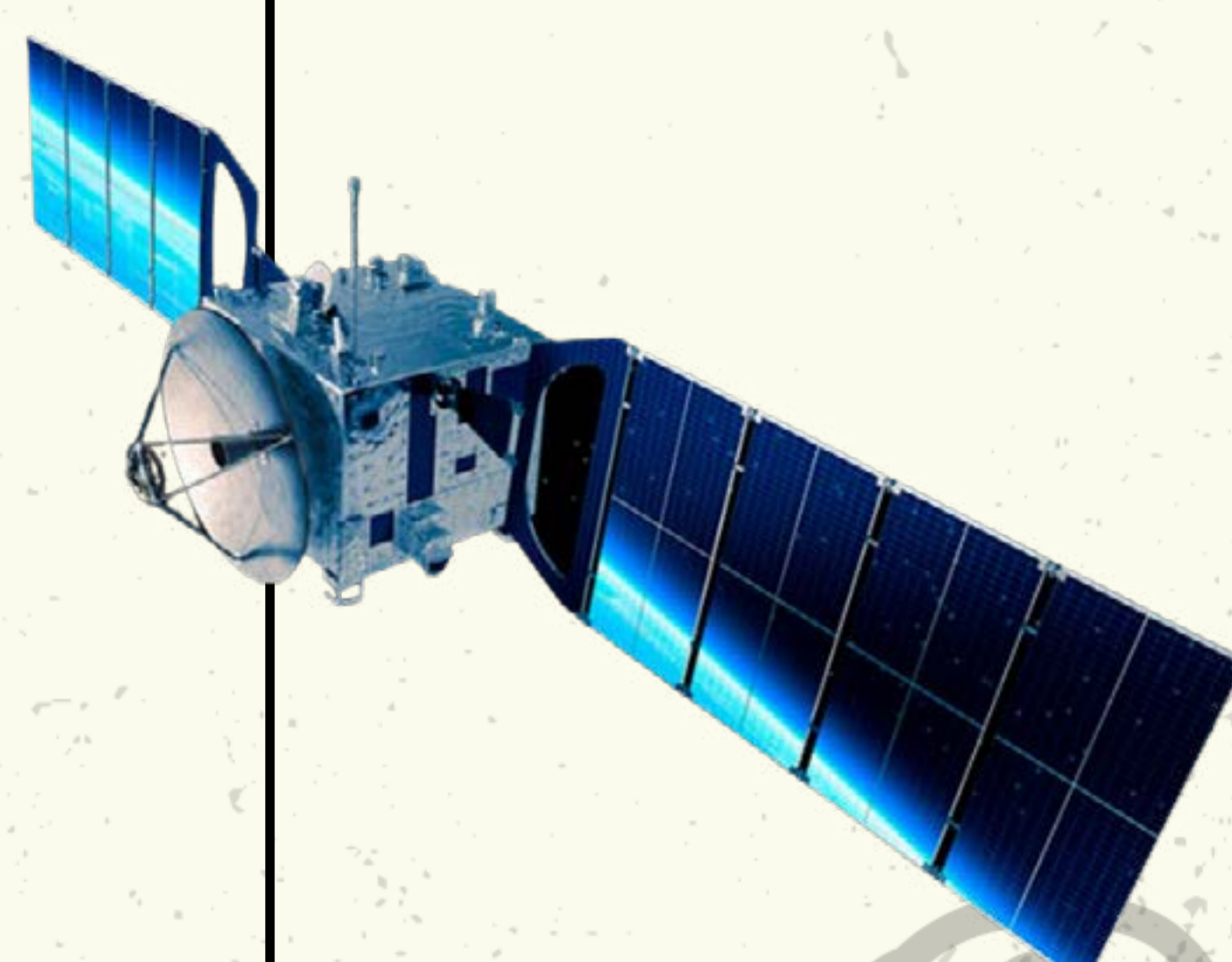
**We have already helped 4,000 people!**

The state was constantly reminded of the need to collect data on people with disabilities. In September, we once again received a response from the state border service of Ukraine that no one knows how many adults with disabilities have left Ukraine. Fight For Right prepared a manual for the authorities on developing policies for inclusion of people with disabilities in decision-making processes.

Since September, together with partners of the NGO “Center “Sotsialna Diia”, NGO “Ukraine without torture”, NGO “Expert Center for Human Rights” and “Ukrainian Helsinki Human Rights Union”, we have started monitoring the observance of human rights in places of detention. In 5 months, we visited 27 institutions in 10 regions and conducted more than 25 hours of interviews.

Based on three focus group studies conducted on the humanitarian needs of people with disabilities during Russia's full-scale war against Ukraine, we have prepared recommendations for providing humanitarian assistance to people with disabilities. In particular:

1. the need to build cooperation between government agencies and public organizations that unite people with disabilities to form a common database of humanitarian needs of people with disabilities and join forces to meet these needs;
2. the importance of decentralizing humanitarian assistance; the need to prioritize humanitarian needs with an individual approach to requests;
3. the urgency of using various methods of communication in forming the base of humanitarian needs of people with disabilities in order to cover the broadest needs of this social group.

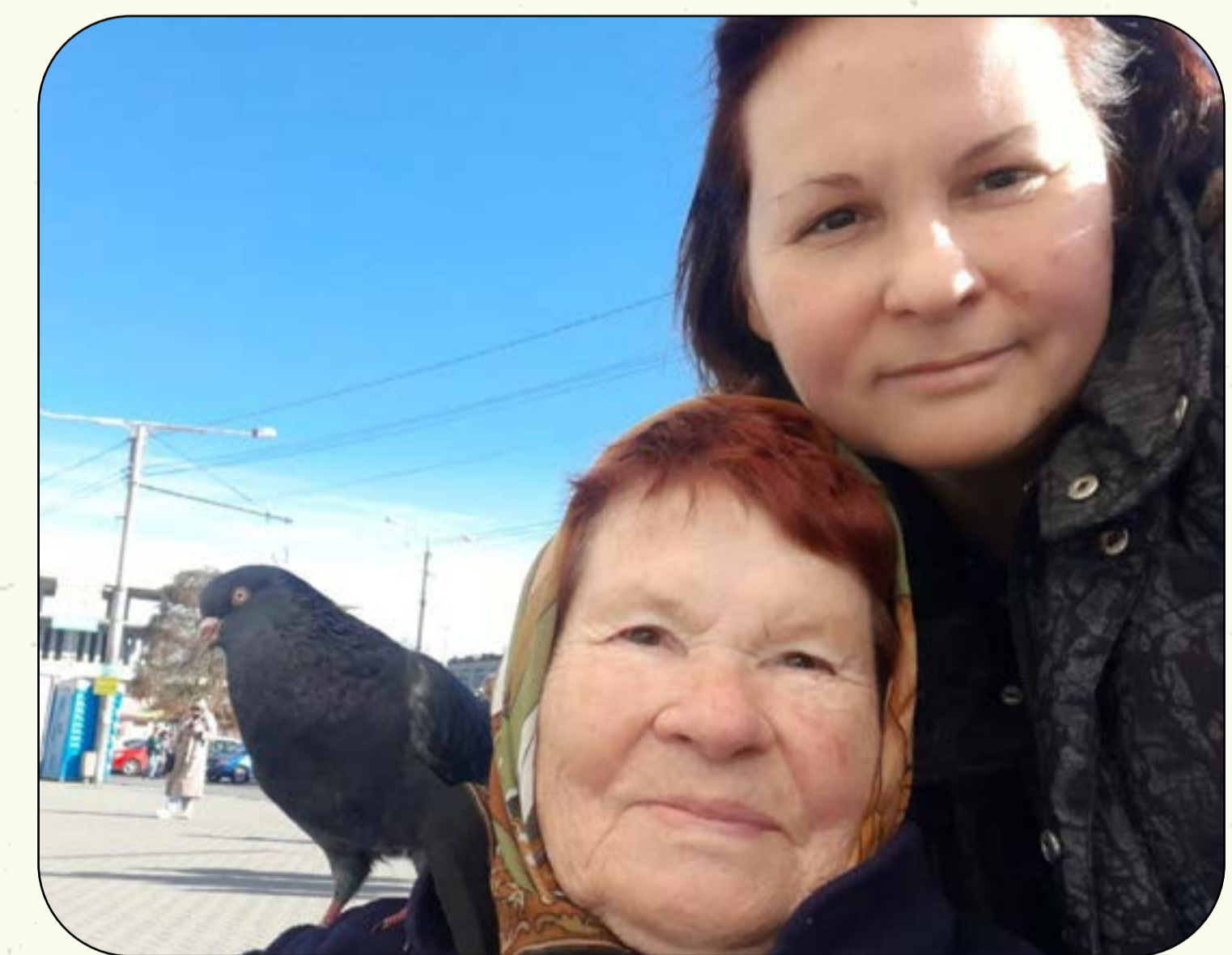

# JANUARY 2023



We received a letter from the family of 94-year-old Anatolii Melnyk, for whom we organized a medical evacuation. It turned out that the man, unfortunately, died, but spent the last months happily, surrounded by his family and grandchildren. Relatives also expressed a desire to organize a gathering in memory of their grandfather and transfer funds to support Fight For Right.

I hope you and your family are doing as well as you can be and are staying safe. I wanted to send you an update on Anatolii Melnyk, my 94yo grandfather, whom you were able to evacuate to Slovakia last March. He spent seven months in Kosice, Slovakia, where me, my husband and my father lived with him. He received two life-saving surgeries the month he arrived.

In December, we were finally able to organize his medical evacuation to Los Angeles, USA, where we live. Unfortunately, my grandfather passed away a few weeks after he arrived. But he was surrounded by family in the end, and he got to meet his great grandchildren.

If not for the help of your organization, we don't believe he would've had this extra year of life and time with his family. We are so very grateful and think of everything you did for us often.

We would like to organize a memorial fundraiser in the name of my grandfather to raise money for Fight For Right. I'm writing because I recently saw you post a video documenting FFR's work on Instagram and would love to include it in the fundraiser page. Are you able to share it with me and is there a chance you have a version subtitled in English? Please let me know.

Our thoughts are forever with you and the people of Ukraine.

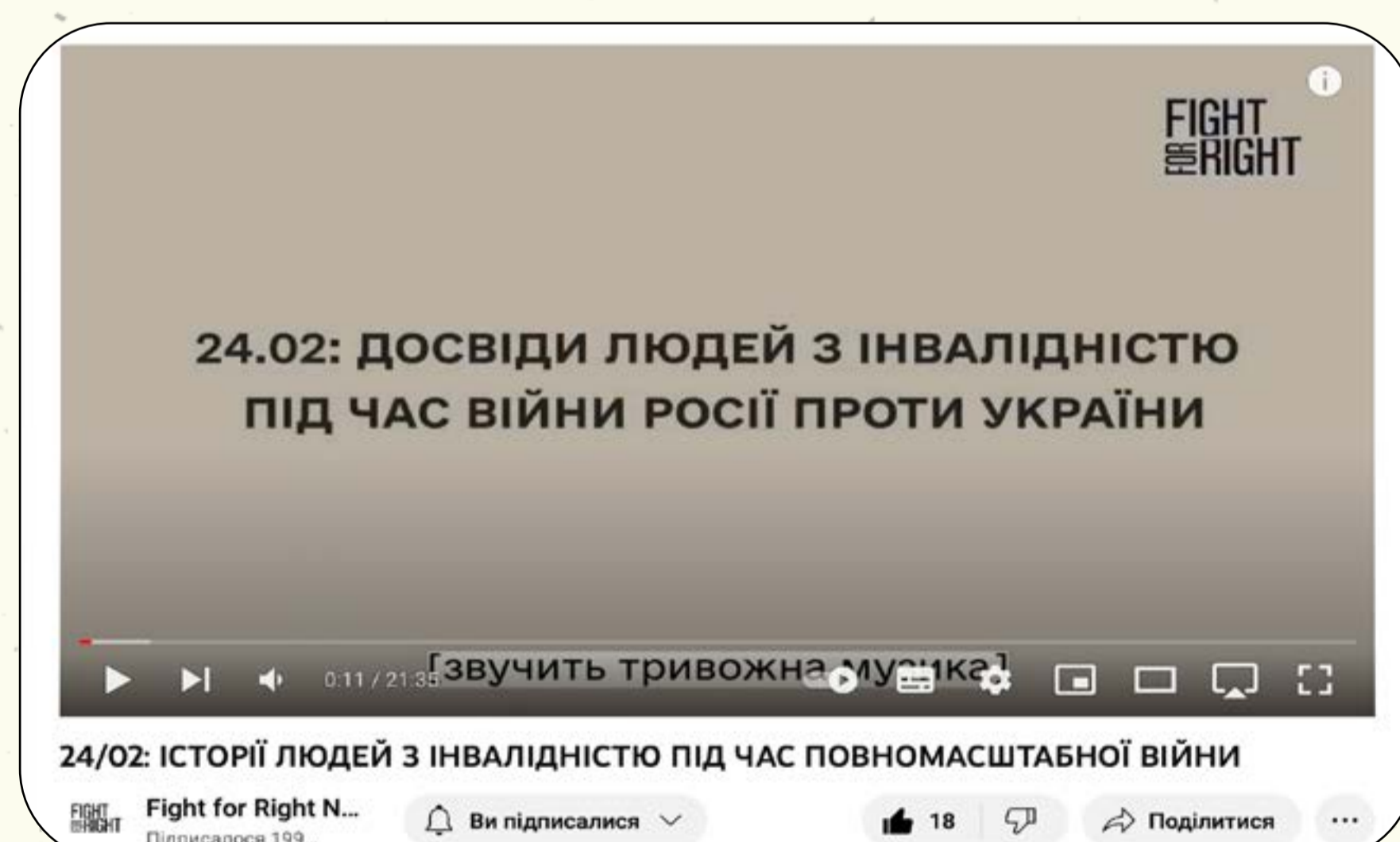

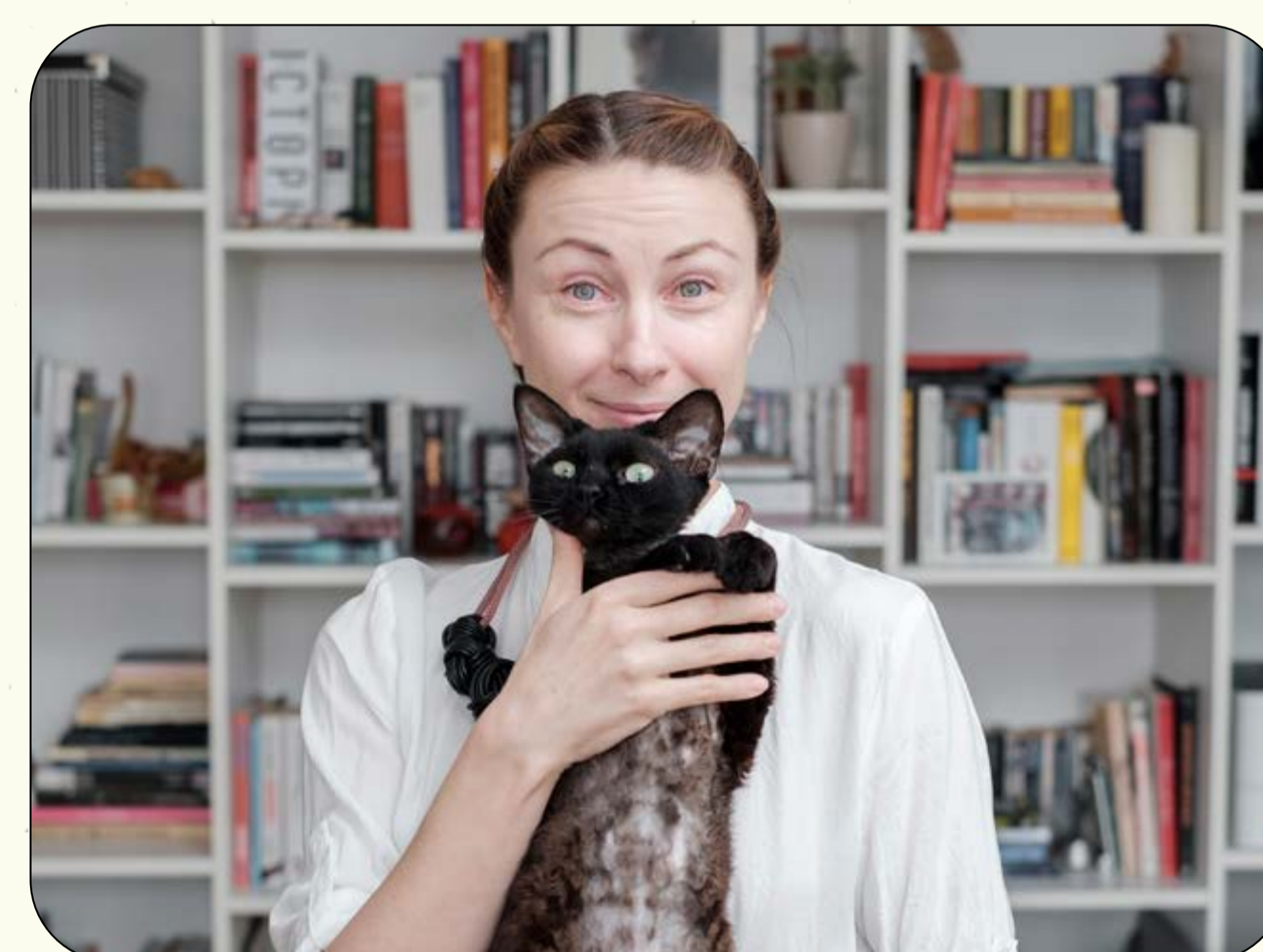


For the first time during the full-scale war of Russia against Ukraine, most of the Fight For Right team met in Malaga (Spain). Not only were we able to work fruitfully, but we were also able to hug in plenty!

From the very beginning of creating the emergency response mechanism, we have adhered to the highest standards of operation:

1. equal to equal – a significant part of our team – these are people with disabilities, many of whom were participants in our “peaceful” projects, are members of the National Human Rights Network Fight For Right, and are volunteers. It is the experience of disability that allows us to understand the true situation of each person, their needs and obstacles that they face, and therefore develop the most effective solutions to help;
2. individual approach – we know that every person with a disability in the world has the right to receive the most appropriate and necessary assistance for them, which is especially critical for saving lives in times of danger;
3. respect for the dignity of every person with a disability is at the heart of our work, as well as an understanding of intersectionality. It is important for us to provide assistance to all people who apply;
4. timely assistance, we try to track critical points, analyze requests and look for not only individual solutions, but also advocate for systemic changes.

# FEBRUARY 2023



During our work during Russia's full-scale war against Ukraine, we carried out **1,485 evacuations**, most of which were carried out by our own transport. We created a transport hub in Dnipro.

Our fearless drivers were both Ukrainians and volunteers from abroad, in particular Sanders Sorsveen Trelvik and Simon Jonsen who were injured during one of the evacuations in January 2023. From the Kherson region, the evacuation was carried out by a deaf driver.



In total we received **18,296 requests** for help to our hotline, social networks, private messages and phone calls from people.
